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IFALPA & ECA outraged at publication of transcript of AF447's crew conversations

Brussels, 18 October: The International Federation of Air Line Pilots' Associations (IFALPA) and the European Cockpit Association (ECA) are outraged to learn that a full transcript of the tape from the Cockpit Voice Recorder (CVR) from Air France flight 447 appears in the book "Rio-Paris Crash: A Collection of Pilot Errors" published recently. We share the revulsion expressed by our member association in France SNPL France ALPA in their press release published today.

It is our firm belief that the sole purpose of a CVR is to aid investigators in determining the factors leading to an accident. Any other use of this data is not only invalid but is an invasion of privacy and can only be described as voyeurism of the worst kind.

Accordingly, we support SNPL France ALPA in its efforts to discover the source of the leak and bring those responsible to justice.
